





Getting on to Ukrainian grammar is interesting. In some ways it is less complicated than English grammar, and in some ways it is more complicated.

Take these words: I, you, he, she, we, they. For starters, there are two words for "you" in Ukrainian. If you are talking to one person and you want to use an informal register, the word is TM. If you are talking to more than one person, or if you want to use a formal register, the word is BM.

Then you use a slightly different form of the verb with each person. In English it is I like, you like, we like, they like ... the only one that is different is he or she likes. In Ukrainian they are all a bit different, as you will see.

On the other hand, making questions and negatives is less complicated in Ukrainian. In English we need an extra word: do or does. We say: do you like bread, does he like honey and I do not like meat. In Ukrainian it is more simple: you like bread? He likes honey? I not like meat. The words do and does are just extras in English, and are not needed in Ukrainian.



In Ukrainian nouns can be masculine, feminine, or neuter in gender. It is easy to guess the gender of a noun from its spelling.

- Masculine nouns normally end in a consonant.
- Feminine nouns normally end with a or я.
- Neuter nouns normally end with o or an e (and sometimes я, but not in these examples).

There is a little bit more to it than this, but the information above gives you a good rule of thumb that will nearly always work. Here are some Ukrainian nouns. Look at the spelling and write them in a row in the table below, according to what gender you think they are.
